


#### Walk the Coleridge Way and the Quantock Hills






Layers of information from a variety of sources

Layers can be switched on and off to help you focus on a particular issue






Most layers of information have <u>information stored within each map object</u> ID 121345644




You can create your own layers to build up your own picture





Base Maps: so you can see where you are

- Set your browser zoom to 100% or lower.




