## **Parish Council**

### **Elections in May**

There are six councillors on the Parish Council and all six places come up for election in May. If six (or fewer) people stand for election then they are elected unopposed. If seven or more people stand for election then there will be a contested election. Voting for this will happen at the same time as the general election on the 7th May. It is still too early to confirm if the election will be contested or not, but a notice will be added to the Parish Council's notice board once this is confirmed.

The May elections will also include elections to the Vale of White Horse District Council. Since the last election there have been changes to the boundaries of the electoral wards. Uffington is now in a ward called Stanford.

### **Neighbourhood Plan area designation**

Currently a group of volunteers are working on a Community Led Plan for our community (the survey for this was distributed recently). Once the Community Led Plan is completed it is possible to create a Neighbourhood Plan (which has more weight in planning matters). The first stage in creating a Neighbourhood Plan is to define the area covered by the Plan and to have this approved by the District Council. Following discussions between the volunteers, the Parish Council and the Parish Meetings for Baulking and Woolstone, it has been agreed to create a single Neighbourhood Plan covering all three villages. This has now been approved by the District Council, so work on the Neighbourhood Plan can go ahead in due course (once the Community Led Plan has progressed further).

### **Vacancy - Clerk to the Council**

Currently I undertake two roles for the Parish Council. These are Clerk to the Council (which is like being secretary to the Council and Responsible Financial Officer (like being treasurer). However over the past four years things have got much busier for me at work and home, so I am stepping down as Clerk (but will continue the finance role). There is therefore a vacancy as Clerk to the Council. This is an interesting role which offers a good way of contributing to the community and learning more about the village. It is a paid role, based on working three hours a week (which can be worked flexibly to fit around other commitments). The core of the role is handling the Council's correspondence and producing the agendas and minutes for the

Council's meetings. No specialist skills or experience is required, just familiarity with normal office software (e.g. Word) and email. 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### News from your District Council.

**The Uffington/Baulking/Woolstone COMMUNITY LED PLAN** is making good progress with high response rates (especially in Baulking) and will guide future decisions about the activities and services wanted in the village. The final report is expected by the end of May and I expect the team to press on with the new Parish Council to prepare a full legally binding Neighbourhood Plan which decides land usage in the villages. This is the most important protection for the village and I urge every family to respond later this year.

**Gladmans PLANNING APPLICATION:** Uffington has had its first experience of a speculative planning application for 42 houses south of the village, between the village and the White Horse Hill, and the Parish Council is aware of other plans in progress. Residents responded robustly to the Gladman application and an impressive case has been put together to defend the 'landscape and character' of that site undisturbed for at least 400 years. We hope to see that application refused by the Vale, but must expect an appeal to Inspectors.

**Vales LOCAL PLAN 2013 to 2031:** Part 1 was submitted for 'Examination' at end of March. We hope for approval which will decide where 19,560 houses will be built in the strategic sites of 200 or more houses. Part 2 will decide where the final 1,000 houses will go in smaller village sites for 50 to 100 houses. Uffington and our villages will be in Part 2, from January 2016, so new housing will be coming to Uffington, but you can decide where it must go and protect what you value most about your villages.

**A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN** decides land usage with the same power as the Vale's Local Plan to control developers and protect settlements. A NP would decide, after consulting all, where development will go and what can be built. You can decide how big new houses must be and how many in each category, so it is possible to ensure affordable homes and starter homes in

the villages. And Gov. has decided that where a NP is in place, residents can keep 25% of the new CIL 'development tax' (Community Infrastructure Levy) for the Parish Council to use in their community. The Vale proposes to set the CIL at £85 per sq ft in the western Vale so there can be real money for the village. All good things flow from a NP!!

**ELECTIONS on MAY 7th** will bring a number of changes to the village. Parish Councillors will be elected for the next period, so do put your name forward if you can serve. There are really important issues for the new Parish Council to decide. And ward boundary changes for the Vale District Council will squeeze me out of a new ward of STANFORD/UFFINGTON into the new ward of RIDGEWAY from Kingston Lisle to East Challow. I will still be your County Councillor until the 2017 County Council election.

I have so enjoyed my time as Vale District Councillor for Craven Ward since 2003. It was a grand new interest in how services are organised and delivered by local government, and these past 4 years with control in the Vale and the duty to progress the Local Plan has been the most interest a retired lady can have! Thank you for your lovely spirit and your active community with so much activity and so many friendly people to enjoy. I will miss you, and send every good wish for speedy progress to a successful Neighbourhood Plan and happy new development!
